Notes from the Office

Welcome back to our returning students and welcome to our new families. Here are a few tips to help you get a great start on the year:

Mornings: Students can be on the playground starting at 9:00 am. Before that time each student should have their parent with them until staff comes out to supervise. Students may come in the building to use the bathroom and for breakfast. Students in the building for any other reason should have an adult with them.

After school pickup: All classes will be brought outside for pickup. K/1 classes in the front of the building and 2-5th on the playground. Please be sure to tell the teacher know you are taking your child and that the teacher acknowledges you before you leave. Any child not picked up by the time the teacher goes back in the building will be brought to the office where office staff will call home.

What to bring: It is a good idea to bring a change of clothes in a large Ziploc baggie to store in your child's locker. Spills at lunch, falls and other accidents happen, and those clothes may come in very handy. Be sure to label everything, even coats, hats, and lunch boxes.

Late arrival or early pickup: If you need to bring your child in late or pick up her up early, always stop by the office first to sign her in or out.

PTA Free Child Care Policy

The PTA provides free child-care for selected PTA-sponsored events.

This policy does not apply to daily before- and after-school care. You must register your child at least two (2) business days prior to the PTA event

Restrictions

Children must be at least 5 years old in order to comply with the requirements of the PTA's liability insurance.

For our children's safety, the PTA has established a 12-child maximum per child care worker.

You may only register for two events at a time.

If you can't make the event, please cancel your reservation promptly, so that we can offer the spot to another family.

About PTA Membership Fees
